
PURPOSE

Our **‘Vision’** describes what we aspire to be; what we want the learning community to look like in five years’ time. Our Vision is a clear milestone along the road towards fulfilling our Purpose. Our **‘Mission’** describes how we will get to our next major destination (achieve our Vision) enroute to fulfilling our Purpose. Our Mission describes how we carry out our business – who we serve and what is distinctive about the things we do. It guides our actions by helping to distinguish between the things we should do and the things we should not do.

The **‘Vision and Mission’** are closely aligned and may appear to overlap. This is inevitable, given that the Mission describes what will be done and the Vision describes the change that will be achieved by doing those things. The Mission statement, however, provides staff with a more detailed guide as to the types of things they need to do and keep in mind as they go about their work for the next five years, to ensure the required changes and outcomes are achieved.

Our highly skilled, dedicated staff will partner with families and the community to support and challenge each student to engage with learning and achieve their best. Our College environment will excite, inspire and enable flexible approaches to teaching.
