WINTER UNIFORM POLICY

With the implemented School Uniform Policy changes there will be a changeover period at the end of Term 1 - beginning of Term 2. We are finding more and more that the variable weather conditions means that students may be either hot or cold in the summer or winter uniform at these particular times of the year.

So for the last three weeks of Term 1 and the first 3 weeks of Term 2 the following applies;

- Students may wear either full winter uniform or full summer uniform from the beginning of Week 9, 27, March with their school hats.
- Hats will NOT be required to be worn when outdoors at school at the beginning of Term 2.

Students are not to mix and match the uniforms.

From Term 2, Week 4, 22 May 2023 full winter uniform must be worn.

Our special guests were treated to a coffee and hot cross bun, enjoying the company of our students while reading a book or two!


It was lovely to have so many involved in this special activity.


