MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Let us be Peacemakers

Welcome to the new school year. I hope that you and your family have had a chance to rest and relax over the Christmas and New Year break.

While we have been enjoying our holidays, it has been hard to get away from some of the events that are happening around our world. The Russia-Ukrainian war is coming up to the start of its third year, with both sides bogged down in ground, missile, and drone conflict. Neither is really making much headway, and so many lives have sadly been lost. At the same time the current Israeli-Palestinian conflict has dragged

on for over 100 days, with little sign of a permanent ceasefire.

We desperately need peace. Now, more than ever, we need to be peacemakers – at home, at school and work, in our community, our country and in our world.

So, our College theme for this year is 'A time for peace'.

In Galatians 5:22-23, it says that peace is one of the fruits of the spirit - Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

And the bible calls us to be peacemakers.

Pursuing peace means making an effort. But we cannot find and maintain peace simply by our own human efforts; we need God's help, and we need Grace, which is His power assisting us and enabling us to do what needs to be done. The efforts we make must be made in and through Christ. Too often we just try to do what is right without asking for God's help, and that type of human effort produces little good fruit.

Jesus says in John 15:5, Apart from Me you can do nothing.

We can't wait to see where their St Martins journey takes them.



















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
