### MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OF MIDDLE SCHOOL



#### **Our Rite Journey Programme**

I recently attended training for the Rite Journey, a wellbeing programme we deliver with our Year 9 students. We have been delivering the Rite Journey since 2019 and have found it quite transformative at this key age.

The basic premise of the Rite Journey is that we have lost rites of passage in our western culture, particularly rites of passage that make it clear to young people that they are no longer children, but seen as adults in our community. Cultures for centuries have undertaken

ceremonies, and created scenarios that make it clear to the young people they are now viewed as adults and need to start behaving as an adult.

In our western world, this lack of rites of passage often leads to young people creating their own rites of passage (drinking, sexual behaviours, risk-taking etc) that they think signify that they are adults. Obviously the behaviours they often choose are unhealthy or even dangerous. Another consequence of not making it clear to young people that they are now adults, with responsibilities, is that we see people living at home with their parents (with their parents still essentially treating them like children) until long after they should have been living and operating independently.

I feel we have seen a significant improvement in our Year 9's since we started the Rite Journey. The students don't always look on it positively as there is quite a bit of time spent discussing students' feelings, experiences and their thoughts on a variety of issues and topics. The boys in particular can find this difficult. I suspect that it's one of those things that at some point in the future they will understand had an impact on them that they didn't realise at the time.

One of the biggest positives with the three lessons a week we spend with the Year 9's is it's a time where they have an adult who is totally focused on listening to them, trying to understand their viewpoint and care for them as a human, not just a person we're trying to shove learning into. The teachers genuinely try to get to know the young person as part of the journey of the year.

Likewise we have just been through a time of the year that emphasises God's love for us and the fact he tried to meet us where we are. The relationship had been broken between God and humans, but God sent Jesus to earth to meet us on our level, to experience our human experience, and ultimately to die on the cross as atonement, and restore our relationship with Him.








# **OLD SCHOLAR EXCELS ON STAGE**
